PALM SUNDAY



Today we commemorate our Lord's triumphal entry into Jerusalem and we begin the journey of Holy Week, the most important week of the Christian year.

Palm Sunday is full of significance. Palms and cloaks were strewn to soften the path ahead for someone important. It is likely that the crowds would have been singing part of Psalm 118, "Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord", and "Hosanna" which means God saves us. The symbolism of the donkey is that it is an animal of peace. A king would have ridden a horse if he was bent on war, but Christ came as Prince of Peace.
