THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

In Luke's Gospel, today we find the disciples huddled together behind locked doors, terrified that the authorities will come after them, struggling to understand the events to which they have been witnesses. Then, from out of nowhere, Jesus stands among them bidding them peace. Jesus meets the disciples where they are. Then by inviting them to touch and see, and by eating some fish, he encourages them to move beyond where they are beyond their fear.

It is here that we are truly able to enter the story. Like the disciples then, we come with our doubts, confusion, fears and misunderstandings. We, through our worship encounter the risen Christ. In the reciting of the scriptures and the preached word we are offered explanation, proclaiming the good news of what God has done and is doing. We may eat with Christ, breaking the bread of the resurrection in the Eucharist. The Spirit brings enlightenment, opening our hearts and minds, setting our hearts on fire. Finally, the exit should be ours, for Christ has sent us out into the entire world to be witness to this amazing news.
