Read Acts 2:1-17 and 5:32

Jesus told the disciples to wait until the Holy Spirit came. (Acts 1:4, 5)

Pentecost = 7 x 7 + 1 = ? It is 50 days since the time of the crucifixion events. Perhaps the disciples feel dis-spirited. They obeyed Jesus and stayed together. (2:1)



The wind is a symbol of breath, life, the Spirit of God. (Unseen but there with us.) This is a sign of a mighty power. (2:2)



Fire is another sign of power. A symbol for light, warmth, the triumph over darkness. (2:3)

The disciples were filled, inspired by the Spirit. Spirit-driven and empowered. (2:4)

The God-filled go out in his name. (2:5-17)

Those who seek to do God's will are the most likely to know and receive the Spirit of God. (5:32)
